

CPEA Rules for 2011

Class Size:

All classes, regardless of size, will be held.

1. Whenever possible, classes with either 1 or 2 horses will be combined.
2. If a halter class is combined, it will move up (e.g., if only 2 two-year-old mares are entered, they will be shown with the three-year-old mares, not the yearling mares.)

Combining of the classes is at the discretion of the show officials.

Grand and Reserves:

1. The grand champion of each sex division will receive one more point than any other in its sex division.
2. The reserve champion will receive one point less than the grand champion.

Point Totals:

Youth and Amateur points will be counted on one horse, one rider.

Tie-Breakers: (as printed in the AQHA rulebook)

1. Use the greatest number of points in the most events.
2. Use the greatest number of horses placed overall.
3. Use the greatest number of points in performance classes.
4. Duplicate awards are at the discretion of the board.

Rules for CPEA Year-End Awards

1. **To be eligible for Year-End Awards, you must pay a membership fee of **\$35 for a single or \$50 for a family** (legal relation at the same address.)**
2. **POINTS WILL COUNT FROM THE DATE DUES ARE PAID and TO QUALIFY FOR YEAR-END AWARDS YOU MAY VOLUNTEER (SIGN-UP) TO WORK AT A CPEA-SPONSORED EVENT (including shows) FOR 1 DAY OR GET A \$100 SPONSORSHIP. THE \$100 IS DUE BY JUNE 1ST. IF YOU SIGN UP AND ARE A "NO SHOW" THE FEE IS INCREASED TO \$200.**
3. **The owner of the horse must be a CPEA member for open awards; the exhibitor must also be a member.**
4. Youth must be a member of CPEA for Youth Awards.
5. **ANY YOUTH RIDING FOR OPEN POINTS TOWARD YEAR-END AWARDS MUST HAVE AN OPEN MEMBERSHIP OR BUY A CPEA OPEN OR FAMILY MEMBERSHIP FOR **\$50**, IN ORDER FOR THE YOUTH TO SHOW AS A MEMBER OF THE OPEN DIVISION.**
6. Amateurs must be a member of CPEA for Amateur Awards.
7. All out-of-state exhibitors wishing to qualify for CPEA open year-end awards must pay the **\$35 or \$50** CPEA state membership for the year prior to showing.
8. The Year-End Awards will be determined by the number of points the horse accumulates in CPEA-approved shows. **The horse must be shown in the respective division a minimum of one-half the time that the class is offered. Special consideration at the board's discretion.**
9. Classes are offered at CPEA shows divided by either the age of the exhibitor or the horse. Under conditions where too few exhibitors are present for each age

group, the classes may be combined at the discretion of the exhibitors or show management. Year-end awards will be awarded to each age group (horse or rider) only in the case where in at least 4 shows the classes were not combined and were held individually.

***To be eligible for these awards, a horse must have shown in at least 2 different performance classes. Only performance classes count. Color is a division, not a class.**

High Point All-Around Open Yearling:

This will be awarded to the yearling with the most points in **halter, color, and longe-line**. The horse must enter all **three (3)** classes a minimum of **four (4)** shows to be eligible. Points in halter and color from all other shows will count.

High Point All-Around Open Two-Year-Old:

This will be awarded to the two-year-old with the most points. The horse must show in at **least one (1) halter (halter or color) and one (1) performance class for a minimum total of three (3) classes**. This can be two halter or color and one performance or one halter or color and two performance classes. The horse must be shown in this combination of classes at least **four (4) shows** to be eligible. Points in halter and color from all other shows will count.

11. Class winners will be recognized.

12. CPEA (All Around Open High Point Horse) (Halter, Color, and Performance; ½ times entered in each) Open Halter and Open Performance Points.

13. All-Around Amateur (Halter and Performance). Must show in Halter, Color, and Performance.

14. YOUTH HIGH POINTS (Janowitz Award)
- ❖ High Point and Reserve Youth Color
 - ❖ High Point and Reserve Junior Youth (13 & Under)
 - ❖ High Point and Reserve Senior Youth (14-18)
 - ❖ Youth and one (1) horse must have shown in three (3) categories (**Halter, Color, and Performance**)
 - Youth awards shall be given on a one horse, one rider basis.
 - Ties for high point awards at approved shows and for affiliate year-end high points will be broken by deciding a winner based on the number of classes entered.
 - Number of first place wins, second places, etc...
15. Rookie Amateur and Youth (**no more than five (5) lifetime PHBA points**) and Exhibitor can complete the show year if points are met before end of show year.
